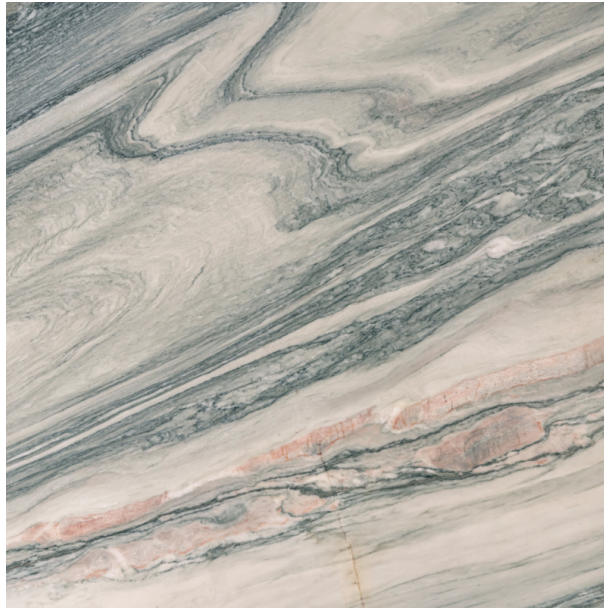

Verde Cipollino marble, also known as Cipollino Apuano, is a precious variety of marble quarried in the Apuan Alps, Tuscany. Since marble is a natural product, any visible defects are to be considered the characteristics of the marble itself. As marble is a natural material, the veins and color tones can vary from slab to slab. Therefore the images are to be considered purely indicative.
